



Samaritan's Feet COVID-19 Volunteer Safety Guidelines

Updated: June 10, 2022

In compliance with the guidelines from the Department of Health and Human Services, SFI will reopen to the public. We have created some general guidelines, as we are committed to protect the health of our volunteers and staff members. These safety measures may be adjusted as we continue monitoring and following local officials' advice on this matter.

1. Minimizing Exposure
2. Face coverings are currently recommended but not required
3. Cleaning and Hygiene
4. Monitoring for Symptoms
5. Protecting Vulnerable Populations

Social Distancing and Minimizing Exposure

- All SFI staff have been advised to stay 6 feet away from volunteers and from each other, when possible.
- There will be touch-less check-in/donation options (complete registration and waiver online. Use your own device/QR code to make an electronic donation. Cash donations will be accepted).

Face Coverings

Cleaning and Hygiene

- We will perform ongoing and routine environmental cleaning and disinfection of high-touch areas in volunteer room and warehouse (bathroom, chairs, doorknobs, tools, etc.)
- There will be two hand sanitizer stations: entrance to volunteer room and warehouse.
- We encourage volunteers to bring their own water bottle. The alternative will be to purchase water from a vending machine located in the warehouse to help minimize exposure.
- Doors will be open, when possible, to minimize exposure
- There will be a trash can outside the volunteer room for disposal of single use face coverings if volunteers should choose to wear face coverings.

Monitoring for Symptoms

- Volunteers are encouraged to self-check for symptoms prior to their visit (fever, cough, shortness of breath, etc.).
- Volunteers that have been symptomatic will be asked to stay home and notify our volunteer coordinator.
